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


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BULLETIN BOARD?

## TWO-METER PROJECT REPORT Andy VE3FZK/W6

I haven't much to report this month, unfortunately, as I was away on a business trip to Atlantic City and didn't get much done myself. I just called up all the project team members I could get through to and it appears I'm not the only one who doesn't have much to report, so I don't feel so bad now! Bob Stein, W6NBI (ex-WA6°IC), seems to be the most active — he has been building up oscillators to see if he can come up with a suitable one for the front end. He also put us on a good lead for cheap parts—— xxxx got me in contact with a friend, Bob Melvin, W6VSV, who owns a parts distributing company, and sent me some samples of fixed and variable capacitors and data on integrated quartz crystal filters whi are far superior to the ceramic ones I am using now, and cost only \$4.45 for 10-49. I guess we can get them cheaper still if we collect 100 hams wanting to build the finalized transreceiver.

Just as a review, here's where we stand on the project:

- 1. We have a team organized with tasks accepted as in the list further below.
- 2. We have a satisfactory IF, FM-AM demodulator p.c. board (bread-board only, not finalized for copying)
- 35. We have a working front end model but lacking in stability and sensitivity.
- 4. We have a 12v. to 13v. (regulated) d.c. converter, but it puts a strong 10 kc interference on the 12v. line because of high peak current pulses I can't seem to get rid of.
- 5. We have a squelch-AF preamp p.c. board (bread-board) that is in pretty good shape except for a lack of dicrimination between true noise and hi's in the modulation coming into the noise amp of the squelch I got a good circuit from Bill Hearn at Signetics for an 18db/octave roll off high-pass filter using only one op-amp. I have it partially installed and plan to get rid of the squelch foul up shortly.
- 6. We have had available several transmitter module bread-boards since last year but the Tx boys are waiting for the Rx team to come up with a comparable piece of hardware before any mating can be started.


