





ON THE AFTERNOON OF MAY 19, 1990, THE STUDENTS OF THE VETERANS ADMINISTRATION'S PALO ALTO WESTERN BLIND REHABILITATION CENTER ENTERTAINED THE CORPS OF VOLUNTEERS WHO ASSIST THE PROFESSIONAL STAFF AT A WHINGDING BARBECUE. THE OCCASION BROUGHT TOGETHER ALMOST A HUNDRED PEOPLE FROM THE PALO ALTO AREA WHO CONTRIBUTE VARIOUS EXPERT SERVICES IN SUPPORT OF THE CENTER'S PROGRAM OF TRAINING VISUALLY HANDI-CAPPED VETERANS IN LIVING SKILLS, MOBILITY, AND VOCATIONAL AND RECREATIONAL ACTIVITIES. THERE WERE SPEECHES, GREAT FOOD (ESPECIALLY THE BARBECUED RIBS), MUSIC, AND A GENERALLY FESTIVE ATMOSPHERE TO EXPRESS APPRECIATION FOR THE VOLUNTEERS' INTEREST AND COMMITMENT. SINCE PAARA HAS FOR ALMOST 3 YEARS BEEN VISITING THE CENTER TWICE A MONTH TO PROMOTE AMATEUR RADIO AS A RECREATIONAL AND THERAPEUTIC ACTIVITY, WE WERE INVITED TO PARTICIPATE; HANDMADE INVITES WERE MAILED TO WALLY PORTER K6URO, JOE HORNE KB6OWG, AND TO STEVE STUNTZ K6FS. DUE TO WORK SCHEDULES, WALLY & JOE WERE UNABLE TO ATTEND, SO STEVE ACCEPTED FROM JOE HENNESSY, DIRECTOR OF THE CENTER, FRAMED CERTIFICATES OF APPRECIA-TION FOR ALL THREE, AND AT THE PAARA MEETING OF FRIDAY, SEPTEMBER 7, PRESENTED THEIRS TO WALLY & JOE. (SEE COVER PIECE WITH ALL 3 HONOREES EMBLAZONED THEREON. -ED) MR. HENNESSY PARTICU-LARLY EMPHASIZED DURING HIS PRESENTATION REMARKS APPRECIATION TO PAARA FOR ITS PARTICIPATION IN SECURING FOR THE CENTER A COMPLETE HF & VHF STATION, DONATED BY KENWOOD & HRO, AND FOR OVER-SEEING INSTALLATION OF RADIOS & ANTENNAS. THE STATION IS USED FOR DEMONSTRATION BY PAARA MEMBERS DURING THEIR TWICE-MONTHLY VISITS, AND WHEN SPARE TIME PERMITS, BY CENTER STUDENTS WHO ARE LICENSED HAMS, -DE STEVE K6FS-



WHAT'S IN A NAME? The Origin of YAESU-

OF THE "BIG THREE" JAPANESE HAM EQUIPMENT MANUFACTURERS - KENWOOD, ICOM, AND YAESU - THE NAME YAESU SEEMS THE MOST JAPANESE. HOWEVER, THERE IS AN INTERESTING HISTORY ATTATCHED TO IT.

WAS CONSOLIDATING HIS POWER AS SHOGUN, OR MILITARY RULER OF ALL JAPAN, OVERSHADOWING EVEN THE EMPEROR. A TYPHOON WRECKED A SHIP OFF THE COAST OF KYUSHU, THE SOUTHERNMOST OF THE MAIN ISLANDS OF THE JAPANESE ARCHIPELAGO. WASHED ASHORE WERE TWO SAILORS, GLAD TO ESCAPE WITH THEIR LIVES, IF NOTHING ELSE. ONE WAS ENGLISH, WILLIAM ADAMS. THE OTHER WAS DUTCH, JAN JOOSTEN (PRONOUNCED YAHN YOSHTEN). THE SHOGUN, DESIRING TO ISOLATE HIS NATION FROM FOREIGN INFLUENCE, MADE THE TWO HIS ADVISORS ON THE WESTERN WORLD. THEY WERE GIVEN VILLAS IN EDO (NOW TOKYO), THE NEW CAPITAL IN THE SHOGUN'S SCHEME. WILLIAM ADAMS WAS LATER USED AS THE HISTORICAL MODEL FOR THE HERO IN JAMES MICHENER'S OPUS, SHOGUN. THE CLOSEST THAT THE JAPANESE COULD COME TO PRONOUNCING "YAHN YOSHTEN" WAS "YAYOSU", LATER CORRUPTED TO "YAESU". THE NAME APPEARS ON MORE THAN RADIOS IN JAPAN. IN THE GENERAL VICINITY OF THE SITE OF JOOSTEN'S VILLA IN CENTRAL TOKYO IS THE YAESU UNDERGROUND ARCADE, A MAZE OF SHOPS, RESTAURANTS, ETC., ADJOINING THE MAIN TOKYO SUBWAY AND RAILWAY STATION. DOWN THE STREET A FEW BLOCKS IS THE YAESU FUJIYA HOTEL.

INCIDENTALLY, ALMOST ALL U.S. HAMS MISPRONOUNCE THE NAME AS "YAYSOO" WHICH SOUNDS TO ME LIKE THE GERMAN "JESU" OR JESUS. ("YAESU, JOY OF HAM'S DESIRING?" TO PARAPHRASE JOHANN SEBASTIAN BACH). AS MY JAPANESE SENSEI (TEACHER) WOULD SAY: "'YAYSOO'? IIE, CHIGAIMASU! TADASHII HATSUON WAS 'YAHACE' DESU YO." TRANSLATION - "'YAYSOO'? NO, IT'S DIFFERENT! THE CORRECT PRONUNCIATION IS 'YAHACE'". 'NUFF SAID. -73 BILL, AA6PA-
