

Atomic bomb collaborator De Liban dies

STANFORD (AP) — Robert de Liban, an engineer on the Manhattan Project and a pioneer in developing automated guidance systems, died Sunday. He was

He had worked at Berkeley's Radiation Laboratory with Dr. Ernest Lawrence, who won the Nobel Prize for inventing the cyclotron.

De Liban, who died at Stanford Hospital of complications following surgery, spent most of World War II at Oak Ridge, Tenn., working on the project that led to the atomic bomb, said his wife, Barbara.

"We all had mixed feelings about the enormity of the devastation," she said about the destruction the bomb brought. "But it did stop the war. That summed up what most of those involved felt."

De Liban, an electrical engineering graduate of UCLA, cofounded Barrett Electronics Corp. after the war. The company specialized in automated guidance systems for military and civilian enterprises.

He moved to Menlo Park in the 1950s and became president of the western division of the company which was sold in the 1980s.

In addition to his wife, survivors include two sons, Richard de Liban of San Francisco and Paul de Liban of Fremont, and his daughter-in-law, Helga de Liban of Fremont.

Landry G. "Dusty" Doster, an avid ham radio operator for more than 40 years — his call letters were K6MPN, died Wednesday at his Redwood City home after a short illness.

Mr. Doster, 64, retired in 1986 after working for 26 years as an electronics technician for Stanford University. He was born in San Diego and moved to Redwood City from there 38 years ago.

He was a member of South County Amateur Radio Emergency Services, Palo Alto Amateur Radio Association, 10-10 International Net Inc., of which he was net controller, and president of the Bay Area Chapter of 10-10.

In addition to his ham radio activities, Mr. Doster was a member and past president of the Sequoia Stamp Club, a member of San Carlos Masonic Lodge 690, F&AM, and an active volunteer at the Redwood City Senior Center, assisting in computer classes.

He is survived by his daughter, Victoria Grant of Redwood City; his mother, Noreene Downs of El Cajon; sisters, Mia of Redwood City and Barbara Bahr of El Cajon; and three grandchildren. His wife Betty Jo died in 1985.

Memorial services will be held Sunday at 2 p.m. in Grace Bible Church, Roosevelt and MacGarvey streets, Redwood City. Private inurnment in Golden Gate National Cemetery, San Bruno, is under direction of the Redwood Chapel, Redwood City.
