

- 2. PAARA has a wealth of interesting sources. Why not ask our aforementioned Boston correspondent to give us an article on telegraph keys, for example, the fastest growing collector's item.
- 3. This triggers another thought. Never in the history of radio has there been such wide fascination with old time equipment, not just antique radios. The Old Timers Bulletin is the official journal of the nationwide Antique Wireless Association. Its 65 or 70 pages are treasured, not just by the undersigned, but to thousands of Hams, and I am sure to all of us if exposed to it. The CHRS has a swap meet, quarterly at the Ampex lot, and each meet seems to have so much greater attendance. The "Electric Radio" monthly is focused on collectors of the old tube equipment. Have you ever listened to the weekly swap net on 7240 KHZ about 4 on week-ends, listing "radios that Glow in the Dark"? Which brings to mind our own Paul, N6FEG, who besides running PAARA's Monday meeting on 2 meters, also is

the organizer and net control of a weekly western military net. Why not ask Paul for a few paragraphs describing his collection of military radio gear? Or a story by Fred Canham on ground and flight radio operators in the Pan Am Clipper era in the Pacific?

4. Just thinking about these matters rouses the imagination. We live in an area which has great radio history predating both Packard and Hewlett and when Silicon Valley was all prunes, cherries, peaches and apricots, without a concrete tilt up to be seen. I am thinking of Hank Olson, an early PAARA member, who has recently published a booklet on KFS and its history. Hank, W6GXN, is reportedly researching another, focussing on KTK Press Wireless, at Pacifica (new name) for Mussel Rock. How about Federal Telegraph which in 1911 had DeForest on its payroll, and later moved to Palo Alto on the El Camino long before the Holiday Inn was ever dreamed of, much less occupying Federal's site near the SP Station. San Carlos' Paul Giganti, W6GVY comes to mind, of nation wide fame as collector of real old receivers. What about an article by Rick (WA6NCX) on Remler Radio, where his father worked alongside John Kaar (later founder of Kaar Engineering in Palo Alto) for a while? And tubes. The wonderful stories of Heintz & Kaufman, South San Francisco, Eitel - McCullough (Eimac) in San Bruno, and Varian in Palo Alto? Perhaps the fabulous Bill Orr, W6SAI, Menlo Park, could give us a talk on the early years.

5. If my focus is too much on the past, why can't we encourage experts in our fold to describe their own stations, operating techniques, antenna projects, whatever. Remember that famed Mike Villard, W6QYT, the father of ham SSB and Stanford Moonbounce, was at the time a member of PAARA, and has spoken to the club on various occasions, when most members now on our roster were still

unlicensed.

(CONCLUSION OF A SERIES)

The Foynes Flying Boat museum, located across the bay from the Shannon Airport, also had an interesting radio section. The flying boats were in their heyday in the period before and through the first years of WWII. They regularly crossed the Atlantic from New York to Ireland and back. A thirty-minute video explained the problems and triumphs of the flying boat era. One room of the museum was called the Radio Room. In it were HF transmitters and receivers used both on land and on the flying boats. They had a Morse code key hooked up to an oscillator for the public to use. A lot of the communications in those days was done by CW. One HF transmitter in the museum stood 6 feet tall, about 4 feet wide and 2 1/2 feet deep. Some of the vacuum tubes on display were about ten inches in diameter and over a foot high. An early Collins receiver was racked up with other receivers nearby. Many other early tubes, plug-in coils, capacitors, and other radio parts were on display. The Foynes Flying Boat museum was well worth the stop whether one is interested in radio or the history of flying boats.

I had expected smooth and easy mobile operation in Ireland. While that did not happen as planned, I did learn a few things that would apply to ham radio operation in most European countries. Were I to go again, I would build up a 1750-Hz oscillator with a tone-burst timer to facilitate repeater access. An earphone and boom microphone with VOX would have solved the problem of not having three hands while driving. Before I went, I would also practice my listening comprehension of English as spoken in Ireland by listening to HF DX to get used to the Irish accent.
