
TM, Fred, Chris, and Bob put in long hours at the front table while Joel, John, and others provided support.

Fortunately, the rally ran very smoothly so there was only minimal use of our communications net. Watching the interesting electric vehicles go by helped pass the time. It was important that we were there, however, in case there had been problems. As the communicators were split into morning and afternoon shifts, everyone who wanted to was able to ride in one or more of the electric cars.
