## PAARA HONORS

#### ADRIANUS SCHRAUWEN W6AJS

PAARA Board of Directors member Adrianus Johannes Schrauwen, W6AJS, has had an extremely interesting life and took the time to share some of it with us this month. For you Dutch speaking readers, his name can be pronounced 'Adri'. However, English speaking readers should pronounce his first name as 'Adrian', not Andreas, like some have been doing for quite a while at PAARA meetings and on the air.

Please wish a happy birthday greeting to Adrian when you speak with him as he has just celebrated his 73<sup>rd</sup> birthday. He was born in The Hague, a large city and the seat of Government in Holland. He

lived there with his father, Henk and his mother, Anna, both Hollander's until 1934. His father was a maritime chief engineer and had taken an on-board ship position which required him to leave the Country for an extended period of time. Anna really didn't want to be away from him for such a long time, so she packed up what she could and took Adrian on a cross country train ride to meet Henk in Marseille, France. From there. the family boarded the ship, the M.S.Sibajak, and sailed for Batavia in the Dutch East Indies. This geographical area is now known as Jakarta, Indonesia.

The family settled in Batavia, while Henk

continued on as a ship's engineer with a local shipping company. In November and December of 1941, the Japanese were attacking Malaya, Singapore and Thailand, (then known as Siam). Henk left the area for Australia to continue working on other freighter types of ships. The Japanese invaded the island of Java in March 1942 (the location of the city of Batavia where Anna and her three children were living). The Japanese started rounding up all of the Dutch residents, separating the men and women and forcing them into detention facilities, much like camps or compounds. Anna became sick at this time and was taken away from Adrian, his younger brother and sister. Adrian was only eleven years old at this time but did what he could to keep his siblings together and protected from their vicious captors. In November of 1942, the 'authorities' split up the kids and took Adrian and his brother to a 'boys center'.

He vividly recalls this as Christmas was celebrated at this facility

in 1942

Shortly thereafter, the Japanese closed down all of the schools, seized all of the books and educational material and burned it in large public burnings or exhibits of power and control. The three children remained separated for many months after this event until Anna became healthy again and was able to locate her missing offspring. She came as often as she could to the various facilities to visit her children but was never actually able to touch them or spend much time with them due to the harsh Japanese imposed rules of detention.

The 'boys center' was closed and all the young males were transferred to a large camp for men between the ages of 14 and 17, while Adrian's sister was sent to a similar camp for young women. Many of the boys over the age of 14 were taken away to work as slave labor for the Japanese and most of them were never seen again. The younger boys were finally moved to an encampment on the S.E. edge of Batavia, (now known as Jakarta). At this point, Adrian had not seen his mother for over a year as it was now 1944.

As a result, Adrian wrote a letter in his very best Indonesian (as Dutch was not allowed by the Japanese), to the International Red Cross and asked if they could assist in locating his mother and sister.

Surprisingly, the Red Cross was able to locate his mother in a women's camp not far away. As a result, Adrian, his brother and sister were finally temporarily united when they were allowed to visit their mother for five minute periods after walking a half an hour to reach the facility. Adrian was only 11 years old while his brother and sister were only 5 and 6 vears of age. It was a cruel experience as the guards insisted that


Adrian recalls an incident in 1944 when he was twelve years of age and found that he had acquired some pennies. So, he escaped from the encampment by pushing some bamboo rods away at the bottom of the fence and walked to a nearby camp operated by the Indonesian's who maintained a small store at the facility. He used his found pennies to purchase cookies for himself and his younger brother. However, upon his return, he was captured and placed into solitary confinement (an abandoned toilet room) for almost two days. Upon his release, he was taken before the camp commander for further punishment. Adrian was only 13 years old at this time. Although this man was an Indonesian, he was working for the Japanese and operating the large human holding facility. He had previously been in charge of prisons for the Dutch Government. This

man used a long, leather whip and whipped Adrian until he was black and blue.

In early 1945 the American Air Force 'Liberators' flew over the island dropping leaflets in several languages, (English, Dutch & Indonesian) stating: 'Keep the faith or Keep up good hope, we will be there soon'. The Japanese were driving around in vehicles with loud speakers warning everyone not to touch the leaflets or they would be shot on the spot. However, many of them were recovered by Adrian and some of the other boys in the camp. The Japanese had also sealed all the radio receivers by taping the frequency knob on a specific frequency and then marking it with a rubber stamp so no other stations could be listened to for any reason. Anyone break-



ing the seal or tampering with the radios would be killed immediately. Adrian and some of the other boys used to tamper with the radios at night and learned to change frequency by entering the chassis from the rear and not disturbing the Japanese seal.

As the war drew closer to the end, the Japanese started separating the Catholics from the Protestants and placing them into different camps. It was not known what their specific plan was when this action was taken. Adrian and his brother were still together and lived in a tiny little building until the end of the war. During this period, Adrian learned where his mother was now being held through information transmitted to him through the local garbage men who serviced most of the camps. Adrian and his brother went seeking their mother

one day when they were allowed to walk outside of the camp. At a point outside of yet another camp some distance from theirs, a Japanese military officer in a car stopped and physically kicked and brutalized the two boys and forced them into the ditch. This incident happened right in front of the women's camp where their mother was detained. The boys were rescued by some passing women and taken inside this camp and ultimately were reunited with their mother. She kept them hidden inside her camp and nursed them back to health. The war finally ended.

While with their mother in the camp just before the end of the war, a notice of death was received regarding their father who was reported to be on board a freighter that had been sunk by a Japanese submarine. As a result, Adrian, his mother, brother and sister boarded the 'M.S. Tegelberg' to repatriate to Holland from Jakarta to Amsterdam. After the ship had sailed, the 'marconist' (shipboard

radio telegraph operator) approached them with a telegram that stated:

'Don't leave Jakarta.stop.I will come & pick you up.stop.Dad'. Apparently he had survived and was returning to Indonesia to find them and reunite his family. They were ecstatic. The two ships traveled different routes so it was over three months later before they all were together again in May 1946 in The Hague.

Holland had been badly bombed and literally devastated during the war, so as a result there was no housing available for returning citizens. So, in December 1946 the family left Holland again on the 'M.S. Sibajak' and traveled back to Indonesia because Henk found a job there on a ship sailing regularly between Batavia and Makassar on the island of Celebes. The family settled in Makassar and Adrian completed High School at the HBS/AMS in 1949. At that point, due to the limited resources, only Indonesian books were available. The family left the island during the summer of 1949, due to an insurrection of the Government by the President Sukarno troops. The family returned again to Holland where Adrian attended and ultimately graduated from the Technical School Breda in N.B. Holland. He was then drafted into the Dutch Army in April 1952.

He became a tank commander and served with the NATO forces for a time and then was transferred into the information gathering division of the Dutch Army Radio due to his special skills and multiple language abilities. (In some circles that is known as being a spy).

During that time of his life, Adrian had some exposure to radio communications. However that interest was interrupted by a friend of his sister who was introduced to him as Antoinette. Needless to say, Adrian could not let this wonderful opportunity pass him by, so he became engaged to her in July 1954 and married her in August 1956. Just prior to all of this excitement, Adrian had been

through the horrible flood of February 1953 in Willemstad which required much rescue and rebuilding effort by the military and citizens of Holland.

Adrian left the Army in 1954 and worked for the telephone company based in Breda. He commuted to work on a bicycle or a bus, depending on the weather. He later moved to Amsterdam and found work as a designer and draftsman. His first daughter, Stella,

was born in Amsterdam and now lives in the Sacramento area. In 1958 the U.S. Congress passed the Pastor - Walter Act which allowed much easier immigration into the United States. So, in February 1960, Adrian, with his wife and baby, arrived in New York on the 'M.S. Rijndam II' and then traveled by train to Sacramento, California, where he immediately found work as an electrical designer draftsman at Wismer & Becker. In 1962, Pam, his second daughter was born and she currently lives in the Walnut Creek area. Adrian moved to Mountain View in the Bay Area in July 1963 and then subsequently to Palo Alto where he has lived for the past 38 years. He has worked over the years as a construction electrical administrator and finally retired in 1996 from Ackerman Engineers. Adrian was a SWL during the early 60's using old military radios and actually owned and operated six scanners at a time for a while.

One of the fellows he worked with was K6GFF. Alexander Boone, (now a SK) who basically was his elmer. So, in 1978 Adrian earned his technician license and was issued call sign KA6ATG. During the 80's, he up-graded to technician and general class and in May 2001 he earned his extra class license and changed his call sign to W6AJS (his initials). He currently operates an Icom 706; an Icom 756 & a Yaesu 817 with an R8 vertical antenna and prefers modes like PSK 31 and an experimental mode known as MT 63. Antoinette retired from the Whisman School District and is still putting up with Adrian. They have been traveling extensively in their retirement and recently celebrated their 48th wedding anniversary. They have returned to Indonesia in 91, 94, 96 and 04 to visit all the places they can remember as kids and the gravesite of Antoinette's father in Kancha-na-bury, Thailand. Her father died as a POW doing forced labor on the Burma railroad during World War II. Adrian has been a PAARA member since the early 80's and really enjoys the activities, although he hopes that there will be more members taking an active part in the club functions. So, please make sure you speak with Adrian at a meeting or on the air and discuss with him where you think PAARA should be going in the future with respect to organized training and events. He is a Board of Directors member and has a keen interest in promoting PAARA. Thank you for your support Adrian. We, the members of PAARA congratulate you and are proud that you represent our fine organization.






