President's Corner

Unbelievably autumn is nearly here already and I can already feel the year heading toward its close. At the time of this writing we are just one month from the equinox and that should yield some nice HF conditions as we approach the fall contest season. With Field Day behind us, we still have several great PAARA events to look forward to as well.



Solar cycle 24 really seems to be more and more active. While there have been quiet periods, we have had several spectacular Coronal Mass Ejections, or CMEs, over the last few weeks and a few flares too. Some have resulted in spectacular Auroral displays as well as some HF blackout conditions. The good news is that we often have enhanced propagation following the high speed particle flux that comes from these CMEs. As I write this, the solar flux index is 75, but the sunspot number is zero. It was, however, as high as 39 last week, and there have not been long strings of zeroes, as there were last year at this time. Evidence of increased activity can also be seen in the background X-ray flux which has been at the B1 level recently. Propagation has been variable, but generally much better. There have been reports of 6 and
