The solar activity we've seen recently is really great and we can expect even more. I've read reports of 10 meter FM contacts across the Pacific and into the Pacific Northwest from our area. SSB on 10 meters has also been working quite well with many people reporting nice DX contacts spanning several hops, implying F-layer propagation. We've also seen a solar flux index up in the 120 range and sunspot numbers in the hundreds. As I write this, the sunspot number is 47 and the solar flux index is 95. These numbers will be decreasing as a large sunspot group rotates out of view. I think that we can look forward to some good high frequency propagation for Field Day this June.

Speaking of Field Day, we had our first organizational meeting a couple of weeks ago at Doug KG6LWE's house. We plan to have some antenna work parties soon, and perform some inter-station interference testing at an upcoming Am-Tech Day. Stay tuned for more information about volunteering, or contact our FD coordinator, Doug directly.

Well, that's it for this month. I'm hoping to see you all at the April PAARA meeting, still at the Menlo Park City Council Chambers. Hopefully I'll be able to update you on the construction at our usual venue soon. Until then, take care.

What is Field Day?

Field Day is a picnic, a campout, practice for emergencies, an informal contest and, most of all, FUN!

ARRL Field Day is the single most popular on-the-air event held annually in the US and Canada. On the fourth weekend of June of each year, more than 35,000 radio amateurs gather with their clubs, groups or simply with friends to operate from remote locations.

It is a time where many aspects of Amateur Radio come together to highlight our many roles. While some will treat it as a contest, other groups use the opportunity to practice their emergency response capabilities. It is an excellent opportunity to demon-

strate Amateur Radio to the organizations that Amateur Radio might serve in an emergency, as well as the general public. For many clubs, ARRL Field Day is one of the highlights of their annual calendar.

The contest part is simply to contact as many other stations as possible and to learn to operate our radio gear in abnormal situations and less than optimal conditions.

We use these same skills when we help with events such as marathons and bike-a-thons; fund-raisers such as walk-a-thons; celebrations such as parades; and exhibits at fairs, malls and museums — these are all large, preplanned, non-emergency activities.

But despite the development of very complex, modern communications systems — or maybe because they ARE so complex — ham radio has been called into action again and again to provide communications in crises when it really matters. Amateur Radio people (also called "hams") are well known for our communications support in real disaster and post-disaster isituations.

What is the ARRL?

The American Radio Relay League is the 156,000+ member national association for Amateur Radio in the USA. ARRL is the primary source of information about what is going on in ham radio. It provides books, news, support and information for individuals and clubs, special events, continuing education classes and other benefits for its members.

What is Amateur Radio?

Often called "ham radio," the Amateur Radio Service is a worldwide community of licensed operators using the airwaves with every conceivable means of communications technology. It is made from people who enjoy learning and being able to transmit voice, data and pictures through the air to unusual places, both near and far, without depending on commercial systems

The Amateur Radio frequencies are the last remaining place in the usable radio spectrum where you as an individual can develop and experiment with wireless communications. Hams not only can make and modify their equipment, but create whole new ways to do things.

Battery Advice from Don Frevert, KG6GLU

My battery charger design worked well until one customer let the system sit many months in a warehouse. The battery was a sealed lead-acid type. The battery voltage sense circuit drawing milliamps discharged the battery completely. Then the system was installed but the battery would not accept a charge. I called the head engineer at the battery company and learned that when a lead-acid battery is deep discharged the electrolyte is converted to water. **This is a non-reversible condition.** Nothing can be done to restore the batteries. So keep your batteries charged and do not discharge a lead-acid battery lower than 2 volts per cell.
