The transmitters were in fine shape, even better than the last time I had seen them, and we then toured the outside of the building to look at the antenna field. After that, it was on to the receive site. We entered the building and saw the receiving console, where the operator was hard at work calling CQ KPH to ships at sea. We went outside to see the wonderful MCI log periodic HF 'discone' antenna, which I photographed in detail. Then there was a great barbecue lunch prepared by Doug and Jim, KI6KVW, and others. There were plenty of buns this time, but unfortunately the veggie burgers were erroneously organic regular burgers (sorry Dave, K6WA, we'll get it right next time). Shortly after this, it was time to say our goodbyes and head for home. The Doyle Drive closing meant that traffic might slow us down, however, it wasn't

Attending were Kristen McIntyre K6WX (Pres), Rick Melrose K6RDM (Sec, Database), Ron Chester W6AZ (Treas), Byron Beck KG6UOB (Dir), Larry Rebarchik N6DB (Dir), Darryl Presley KI6LDM (Dir). A quorum was present.

President's Report: Kristen K6WX reported that the presentation at the May 4<sup>th</sup> meeting on the California Near Space Project about the Transcontinental Transatlantic International Balloon flight of CNSP-11 (APRS call K6RPT-11) from San Jose, CA, to Algeria, by Don Ferguson Al6RE and Ron Meadows K6RPT, did a fine job of telling the story of the balloon flights leading up to the record breaking flight. The June meeting will feature Dean Straw N6BV, with our traditional Field Day warm-up and insight into his QSO handling expertise.
