
California QSO Party (CQP)

The first full weekend of October marks the annual running of the California QSO Party (CQP) – the most fun you can have with a radio if you live in the Golden State! This year marks the 46th running of CQP sponsored by the Northern California Contest Club.

Why contest? From an operating point of view, most aspects of Ham Radio from Public Service, chasing DX to working contests have one thing in common – accurate and timely copying of information often under stress.

Entering a contest either casually to give some points or as a serious effort, is a great exercise in operating "under fire".

The first full weekend of October (October 6th & 7th this year) sees the annual running of the






