Third time is a charm!

Hard to believe, but after 2 attempts over the last 3 years to find the time to study for the Extra test, I found a way to succeed. For me, reading through the ARRL's extra exam book wasn't helping me get though the information such that I could make it all the way to a successful conclusion. Now there is nothing wrong with the book as it had served me well for my Tech & General exams. I did find that Gordon West's, KB6NOA, book was of extra assistance in studding for my General. As the test questions changed from the 2nd time I tried, I opted to just purchase Gordon's book for my 3rd swing at this. Once again I tried to get through the book and once again I struggled to find the time to read through all the content. As I made it further through the information the 3rd time, I found myself looking for alternatives so I could cross the finish line.

The options aren't many as there haven't been many extra classes to attend and when there was one, it wasn't close or at a time that would work. Then there were the audio disks by Gordon West. Realizing that I had 40 minutes or more every day when returning home from work which I could listen to Gordo's disks, I wondered if they could help. During Pacificon last year I spent a few minutes talking with Gordo about his

audio disks trying to learn how the content was presented.

For the next 1 ½ months I listened to the disks on my way home. I even ripped them onto my iPhone so I could listen to them most every day when I took my 30 minute lunch walk. For me, Gordo presented the info in a manner that kept me interested with the content sinking in even though I wasn't looking at his book when I was listening.

During the 1 ½ months, I'd spend some spare time looking through his book and trying to answer the questing without looking at the answers. This approach helped sink the visual component into my mind and also let me see what all the possible answer choices were (you know, the ones that trip you up) not just the answers which is the way it's presented in the disks.

Along the way, I found an iPad app called "Exam Prep" by Patrick J Maloney, LLC. What an easy way to work through all the questions! You can read the question by group with the answer showing or have to select what you think the answer is and get immediate feedback. You can take practice exams and choose if you want immediate feedback or not. The app tracks each time you take the practice exam and provides you information on your percentage of correct answers by group so you can see what group you may need to spend more time on. You can even review each test and only look at the guestions you missed. Now I used some programs similar to this on the computer when working toward my other licenses, but they lacked the tracking this app has. With it being in a portable device, I could work on the questions whenever and where ever time presented its self.

I suppose this sounds like an ad for the products I used and I know others have taken a similar approach, but I also know others who also have been challenged to get through the contend or had problems finding the time to get through it. I'm happy to say that this worked for me and it might just work for you. Catch you on the Extra bands!

Kevin, AD6Z (Thank you!). After getting all of the CW keyers programmed with the appropriate FD messages, we all grabbed a burger or two and discussed strategy.

The event itself began earlier this year, on Thursday, because of a change in the rules. With a bit of extra setup time, Doug, KG6LWE, and his tower crew were able to get everything set up well in advance of FD start time of 11 AM on Saturday. Rick, N6DQ's new military towers made putting up several of the stations a real breeze. For the first time we didn't have to use Gerry, N6NV's truck to lever up any towers; a very scary operation indeed! By the time I arrived on Saturday morning, the U-Haul truck was in place and ready to go. All I had to do was get my gear out of the vehicle, and plug everything together. We had a slight hitch with the length of the coax to my station. and some minor computer setting issues, but with 10 minutes to spare, I was ready to go. The tribander on top of the 40m beam was a bit twisted, but it didn't matter. It was close

enough. The rotator compensated for the twisting.

The 40m / 15m CW station wasn't the only station I had to get ready, however. I also had to get the GOTA station set up. I ran down the hill with the rest of the gear and got that going. Then we were truly on-the-air. The rest of the day was filled with running around for me, talking with visitors, and with other hams. We had visitors from CMU West, courtesy of Bob, W6EI, and the press was there from the San Jose Mercury News. We had a nice article that appeared both on the website and in the print edition. The GOTA station was so busy that there was a long line of people wanting to operate. It was great to see. Joel, KD6W, made a number of satellite contacts, despite an early failure of a switch in his rotator controller. The 20m / 80m CW station, and the two phone stations cranked out the Qs all day and into the night. It was glorious.

I had an interesting night on 40m. The band started very long, with contacts starting into the East Coast, and then it shortened up as the night wore on. This is the reverse of its usual behavior. I worked DX into Japan. In the morning, 15m was great, and I had a steady flow of contacts, including DX into HK and ZF. I was busy all night long. There really were no significant lulls. I also made a number of natural power Qs, and that activity was captured by Jim, KI6KVW. Dave, K6WA, kept me company until 2 AM, and Frank, AF0XX, kept the caffeine flowing.

All in all, it was a fantastic Field Day. We'll be processing the logs and report our score to you soon. Propagation was poor at best, and we weren't the only ones reporting this, so expect the score to be down a bit.

We have two events coming up - a PAARAtrip to KRE on July 20th, and the PAARAshoot at the 10th Street Range. More details on the website at <u>paara.org</u>.
