Youth in Ham Radio

I have been doing some research to learn more about how I can help promote the hobby to youngsters. I started by contacting Carole Perry (WB2MGP), Columnist WorldRadio Online, Retired NYC teacher, Chair Radio Club of America Youth Activities Program. Promoting HAM radio with kids is her passion! The Youth Activities program is pretty cool in that it helps get radios donated to schools. Carnegie Mellon recently benefited by getting radios donated through the program.

Carole also hosts youth panels and forums around the world. She hosted the Youth Panel at Pacificon last year and will be doing so again this year. The aim of the Youth Forums is to highlight creatively technical young hams. The Youth Panel she did at Pacificon had several college students who spoke of their amateur radio club, a 12-year-old whom she invited to her Dayton forum, and a former young presenter who is now the president of the amateur radio club at Stanford University. The purpose of these forums is to inspire other young people to get involved and to consider technical pursuits.

Carole told me that, "The main reason for the kids I meet to get licensed is they are from ham families or they've gotten exposed to it in school. There's camaraderie and a service aspect to it that social media doesn't have. They also enter the job market being much better trained than others in technology." An aspect that I didn't consider was how the hobby influences career paths. In addition to Carole's comment, I found many references online where youngster's career paths followed a technical path due, in part, to their involvement in HAM radio.

I have also reached out to Debra Johnson, ARRL Education Services Manager to obtain more information about youth in HAM radio. From what I understand, youth licenses are on the rise. As I poked around the ARRL website, I found a web page dedicated to Youth Out-

reach at http://www.arrl.org/outreach-to-youth. There, you will find information on Helping Kids Discover Morse code, Amateur Radio and Scouting, Outreach to Teachers and Schools, and other stories and resources. I intend to send an invitation to the Fremont (my home city) School district to share with teachers to promote the hobby. I'm hoping that I can encourage more kids to visit a field day location.

Speaking of youth in HAM radio...are you aware of the Youth Net every Saturday at 14:00 (local time) on the N6NFI Repeater, 145.230 MHz, negative offset, PL 100 Hz OR via Echolink nodes KR6DD-R (271122) or N6WN-R (477737)? Participation on this Net has been a bit sparse lately. If you have a son, daughter, niece, nephew, or neighbor, why not be the control operator and help them get on the air for this Net? It's a great opportunity for kids to get on the air and may be just the catalyst they need to get involved in the hobby!
