No matter what you get, I hope you have some fun on the radio at this time. You can, for example, work the Santa Claus Arctic Circle Team from Finnish Lappland. You'll hear them as OH9SCL on HF, all modes. They will be active throughout December.

Speaking of things that happen this time of the year, there is the Fessenden Christmas Eve (UTC) commemorative transmission from experimental station WG2FXQ. They will be on 486 kHz from Virginia. This is to commemorate the anniversary of the first audio transmission by Fessenden in 1906. The station will also be on the air on New Year's Eve and New Year's Day. Did you copy them? There is also the SAQ Alexanderson alternator transmission on 17.2 kHz from Sweden. This is a tough one to get (have they ever been copied from the West Coast?), so please let us know if you do copy the signal. The power output should be around 100 kW, so you never know. A Short review of the Countycomm GP5-SSB

A lot of the regular attendees of the monthly PAARA meeting have probably noticed some of the members talking about new very compact shortwave receiver made by Countycomm, the company of our friend Nick, N6VOA. So what is this receiver about?

The GP5-SSB is a super compact receiver with extensive coverage on FM, AM broadcast band as well as shortwave, barely as large as a small TV remote. The story behind it is that like many products from CountyComm it came from a government request, this time for a small and high performance receiver to use for emergency purposes. CountyComm worked with SiLabs, who manufacture single-chip radios, as well as Dr. Edison Fong, WB6IQN, to create a device that would fit the bill.

They ended up using the excellent Si4735; which is a full featured one-chip receiver, but with a twist: if you look at the specs of the GP5-I SSB (http://goo.gl/PFKPWr) and those of the Si4735 (http://goo.gl/n0mUAT), you will notice: that there is some secret sauce going on! The GP5-SSB SW coverage goes beyond what a regular Si4735 can do, and more importantly, it is also able to demodulate SSB.

Pretty much every Ham I know who has had a GP5 in their hands has commented on its excellent sensitivity: despite its small size, it is a grown up receiver. It will not beat your Ham transceiver on ease of use, since it does not have direct frequency input nor very fast VFO control, but it does have lots of memories, so you can pre-program frequencies across Ham bands to jump very fast across them. And it does have a couple of nifty scanning features that will enable you to get a quick overview of activity on a particular band. While the built-in whip will give you decent reception, clipping a longer wire to it will of course improve things a great deal.

In a nutshell, Nick and his company have managed to design a wide coverage radio that works great for Hams for quick monitoring of the bands for activity or act as a small second receiver. Since we all live in the Bay Area, it also makes very good sense to stow one of these into your earthquake kit as an emergency receiver. Another really nice feature is the presence of a mini-USB plug to power the receiver, and even recharge the internal AA batteries if you use NiMH. Good design at work. A quorum was present.

President's Report: Kristen, K6WX, mentioned how many comments she's received from members and non-members of PAARA with regard to how many wonderful and diversified events PAARA conducts each year. The comments she's received include the December Dream to Reality raffle that Jim Rice, K6AK, put together. Congratulations go to Jim for another great raffle and the board for coming up with another winning grand prize.

Thanks also go to Eric Swartz, WA6HHQ, for an enlightening talk on the new "toys" Elecraft has developed in the last year. We know there were many thoughts of upgrades floating through the minds of those in attendance.

Kristen indicated her reserve of stories is still dangerously low and is in urgent need of more stories.
