mation work really well. Thanks to the work of PAARA member Rick. N6DQ, inter-station interference is minimal to non-existent. All of that works like clockwork. NPOTA Challenge by Ron Chester, W6AZ

The ARRL NPOTA program seems to be quite a hit. Our very own members, Rick & Joanna, N6DQ & K6YL hit the road to activate a bunch of NPOTA sites. And every day, I've been seeing messages posted on the QRP-L mailing list about NPOTA activations by N2CX as he drives around on the East Coast. Joe, N2CX, is a QRPer, a member of the QRP Hall of Fame, and portable operations is like second nature for some of these folks. So far Joe has activated 58 different locations!

I got to thinking about places to go to do an NPOTA activation. At one of our meetings, Rick, N6DQ, mentioned that Pinnacles is a National Park. I probably live closer to that one than anyone else in the club. Maybe Doug Teter would be number two. So I (or we) could go there. But I wondered whether there might be somewhere closer, so I studied the ARRL NPOTA rules. One entire evening I studied them! Many years ago, we worked hard to optimize our Field Day results by studying the rules and applying them to our Field Day setup. I was doing the same with the NPOTA rules.

Bottom line, I found a spot closer than Pinnacles. In fact I found three of them! Then I started thinking about PAARA. Recently the Board announced that it wanted to move in the direction of doing more portable operations, besides just Field Day. Doing an NPOTA activation would be pretty cool. So I started looking for a good place for PAARA to do that. I found one. But so far, it's my little secret. The Challenge in the title of this article is that I want to challenge other members to study the ARRL rules and find good sites for NPOTA activations by PAARA. And specifically to see whether anyone could come up with a spot even closer for PAARA than the one I've found.

Jim Thielemann, the PAARA Secretary, will be the judge. I have shared my secret with him and no one else. On Saturday at Field Day, I told him the spot I have located for an NPOTA activation. I want to see what locations other members come up with. After you find one, send me an email (my address is in the list of officers in this newsletter) with three bits of data: (1) the name of the location you found, (2) the ARRL NPOTA Code for that location, and (3) the driving distance on a Google map from that location to Cubberly Community Center, the location of our monthly meetings. The location you choose must qualify as a proper NPO-TA site according to the rules, you must have the correct ARRL Code for it and we're looking for the shortest driving distance to our club meeting location.

Jim knows the spot I have found. At the July meeting, my plan is to announce the locations other members found, as well as the one I found. Jim will be able to vouch for the fact that I had already identified the location I found by 6/25/16 and what it is. *The winner of this challenge is the one with the shortest driving distance*, as specified above. Of course there can be a tie; there can be more than one winner. When PAARA activates the closest location, the winner(s) is (are) guaranteed to be given the chance to run our station during the NPOTA activation. Okay, start. See if you can beat me.



2nd Grundig Eton Traveler III AM/FM/MW/LW/SW RDS/Radio Data System


