# **Contests and Operating from Aruba** ED MUNS, P49X (W0YK)

Ed, WOYK, has operated from Japan, Jamaica, Aruba and The Galapagos. Since 2005, he has made 4-5 trips per year to Aruba for 1-2 week periods, operating CW and RTTY contests. In 2008 and again in 2019, along with station owners AE6Y/P49Y and W6LD/P40L, disassembled the three towers and antennas, rebuilding them with all new material. The indoor portion of the station undergoes constant upgrading and improvement.

Operating from a DX location has challenges, especially if it involves maintaining a station in a salt-water environment. Today's remote-operation technology can reduce the travel, but it also increases the station complexity and maintenance work. There are a number of ways one can get started in DX operation that range from traveling to an existing DX ham's station to joining an existing multi-operator trip to owning and maintaining a station overseas.

# BIO

Ed, W0YK, entered CW and SSB DX contests initially in the early 1970s as a way to work new band/modecountries for DXCC. His interest rapidly evolved from DXing to contesting with his early learning at the KORF multi-multi. Today, CW and RTTY contesting dominate Ed's operating time. His local contest club, the Northern California Contest Club (NCCC), mounted an effort for the club competition gavel first offered in the 2004 ARRL RTTY Round-Up where Ed reluctantly (kicking and screaming) learned how to setup RTTY and ultimately won the Pacific Division SOHP plaque. He ironically enjoyed that induction into RTTY so much that he now includes all the major RTTY contests in his contesting schedule.

With his P49X call sign, Ed holds the world SOHP record in ARRL RTTY Round-Up, having broken the record eight times, and the world SOHP record in CQ WPX RTTY, having broken that record seven times and set a world SOHP record in the 2010 CQ WW RTTY.

He was inducted into the CQ Contest Hall of Fame in May 2014. This is his thirteenth year at CTU delivering the two Digital Contesting presentations and Q&A.

## Field Day 2020

In the midst of the Covid-19 pandemic, and the associated shutdown of life as we know it here in the Bay Area, the PAARA Field Day planning committee has been trying to figure out how to hold the event while keeping participants safe.

Ric, N6AJS, our CW-B station captain for the last several years, came up with a proposal for a modified Field Day, which assumes that Shelter-in-Place rules have been relaxed, but not eliminated entirely. We are planning on that basis, but caution everyone that circumstances beyond control may make even this scaled down operation impossible.

# The Plan

Under the assumption that large gatherings (more than 10 people) will still not be permitted, or should at least be avoided, we will likely not i be permitted nor really want the use of our usual venue, Bedwell Bayfront Park in Menlo Park.

Caution dictates that we keep the number of attendees to a minimum at any given point over the weekend, which the use of almost any public space would make difficult at best. The biggest private space available to us is my 5-1/2 acres, so if we are able to do any kind of group effort this year, it will be in San Martin.

We think it likely that we will still be observing precautions like social distancing, maskwearing, and sanitizing everything.

To keep setup and the number of people here at any given point manageable, we will reduce the overall size of the operation from our usual entry in Class 4A (4 primary transmitters, operating on generators). We will instead enter in Class 2A, with a smaller and less laborintensive setup. We will unfortunately, also be forgoing our usual GOTA station and all of the public outreach effort.

To minimize potential exposure risk, we will do our best to limit the number of people at the site to no more than 10 ideally. We will still attempt to keep both HF transmitters on the air for the entire 24 hours of the event. This will require that operators and loggers sign up for COMMITTED slots in the schedule. Ric is working on an on-line schedule that you can use to sign up. You'll be able to find it at:

Unlike our usual practice of having dedicated CW & phone stations, we plan to be modeflexible, hoping to maximize points by using digital modes and CW for 2-point contacts whenever possible. Please indicate your preferred operating mode when you sign up. We will do our best to accommodate.

We will be sanitizing radios, keyboards, mice, keys/paddles and operating positions between shifts. We're still considering our options for food & drink.

Due to the relative difficulty of effectively sanitizing headsets, we will be following a BYOH (Bring Your Own Headset) policy. Radios will be equipped with 3.5mm jacks, stereo for earphones, mono for Mic. Operators wishing to bring a headset that does not match these connector types, will be asked to bring whatever adapters will be needed.

Unfortunately, casual visits will be out for this year. The gates will be closed to keep in's and out's to a minimum. Operators, loggers and support personnel will be the only ones allowed on-site. We realize that this means forgoing the usual visits by elected officials, and served agencies, and the points we usually garner from those visits.

The situation dictates the conditions. We MUST i do this safely, or not at all.

As the League has encouraged us all to do, we are adapting our operation to the conditions at hand. While the scope of things will be reduced, we will still need operators and loggers, I and encourage club members to sign up for operating slots well in advance of the event.

Stay tuned to PAARAgraphs, the Club website and the Monday evening net for further develop- ments.

At the time of my writing, we still aren't 100% sure Santa Clara County will lift the restrictions enough for us to even hold the planned drastically scaled-down event. We'll do our best to get the word out regarding the final plan through the 9 AM Talk-Net, Monday night PAARA Net, and the web site as we get closer to June 27th. We may also have a format change in the June meeting. A presenter has stepped forward who is willing to give his presentation using Zoom. As I draft this letter, we're still working on the logistics so stay tuned. There may be more current information on the 1st page of PAARAgraphs as this column is drafted before PAARAgraphs has begun being assembled.

Hopefully, you've been able to take advantage of some of the band openings that have popped up. There's been increased activity on 15M and 17M along with the usual large amount of activity on 20M. Now and then, 10M becomes an active band. Sometimes only for the short-haul but more likely for long-haul contacts. Unfortunately for my experiencing ham radio, work has kept me out of the shack except when joining one of the many Zoom meetings I've needed to participate in. Though my shack isn't exactly my office, it is the best and quietest place to hold or join a Zoom meeting. Board members can attest that my daughters' Cockatiel can chime in with comments at interesting times during a meeting as he did at the last board meeting because I was late to start the meeting and conducted it in from the kitchen.

Joel, KD6W, made progress in getting a 900MHz repeater operational on his bench. He's filed documents to coordinate the repeater frequency of 902.225. He procured a much larger 900MHz station antenna to replace the small one we put up when the tower was originally installed. The larger antenna will increase the coverage area considerably. Shortly, once the restrictions on sheltering in place have been relaxed, he'll be looking for a few volunteers to help with a small work party to swap out the antenna, run two sections of 3/4" helical hard line down the tower, install the repeater hardware and make it operational. At the same time, we may finally be ready to install a battery back up system consisting of surplus UPS systems Doug, KG6LWE, salvaged from a project he was working on.






