Announcing a contest within an event

The PAARA board gathered on Zoom for a couple of quick meetings a few days after the board meeting to consider the idea of a PAARA club member competition as part of Field Day this year. As there isn't an official PAARA FD site this year due to conditions out of our control, the board agreed that a bit of friendly competition would "spice" the event up a little. Thus, the PAARA club contest was born. Please check out the rules, which are rather straight forward.

The board debated on what the prizes should be tossing around several ideas. Our concern was having a prize that was of use to the winner. Thus, the idea of HRO gift certificates. The board felt the diversity of products at HRO could surly fill someone's need for new "something or another".

We also wanted to recognize any teams, more than one operator using a common call sign, independent of single operators. Realizing that team scores would, by their nature, be higher than for single operators, we created a separate first-place prize for them. However, we also felt there would be far more single operators than teams thus we decided to have 2nd and 3rd place prizes for single operators.

We hope all members can find some time over FD weekend to participate. Several clubs in the Bay Area have worked together to develop a plan for operation on 2M simplex. Please check out the "Field Day 2020 on 2M" for information.

Also note: there is a PAARA sponsored Zoom meeting during FD for members to chat, get assistance, or whatever during FD. It's an unmoderated "drop-in if you which" place where PAARA members can engage other members. I will open the meeting secession at or around 9 AM on 6/27. It will remain open for 24 hours. PAARA Field Day 2020 CLUB Participation Rules (it's not a contest)

To encourage participation in the upcoming Field Day, even without our traditional W6ARA operation, PAARA is announcing the PAARA Field Day Contest, with prizes for club members.

- Any member in good standing before the start of Field Day on 6/27/20 is eligible to participate.
- Each participant must submit their log with their callsign through the ARRL web page (http://field-day.arrl.org/fdentry.php) and list the "Palo Alto Amateur Radio Association" as their club. Note: the ARRL will not recognize PAARA as the club thus the name must be spelled out. Your entry to this contest is your submission of your log to the ARRL. The ARRL submission deadline is 7/28/20.
- Contest winners will be announced after the ARRL posts the results of Field Day in November. The ARRL published scores will be the sole determinant of the winners.
- Individual awards are based on scores turned in by a single operator, and not the operating category, against all other PAARA member single operators.
- Teams of two or more operator stations under one callsign will receive a separate 1st place prize. Their score is also based on the ARRL published scores against other PAARA member team scores.

- The top scores will receive HRO Gift Certificates as follows
 - a. First place team \$350
 - b. First place single \$350
 - c. Second place single \$200
 - d. Third place single \$100
- 7. As this contest is intended to encourage general membership participation in Field Day, PAARA Officers and Board Members are excluded from participation.
- The awards and prizes will be handed out at the December 2020 General meeting, assuming we will be allowed to convene. Otherwise, prizes and certificates will be distributed in the mail and winners published in PAARAgraphs.

Meeting was called to order at 7:10 p.m. A quorum was present.

Key Items:

The July PAARA general meeting will again be virtual, via Zoom. We will meet on July 3, NOT on July 10 as we would if we were meeting in person. See the PAARA website for more information.

Field Day:

The Board decided unanimously to cancel the W6ARA Field Day for 2020. This is due to several factors including: Low member interest and signups; The ongoing Santa Clara County activity restrictions; The number of members in atrisk groups.

Club members are encouraged to operate their individual stations, and to submit logs to the ARRL using the web portal http://field-day.arrl.org/fdentry.php listing "Palo Alto Amateur Radio Association" as the club. Club credit by the ARRL WILL NOT be given to the club if you use "PAARA" for the club name. They are requiring the "Official" name of the club without acronyms.

To encourage club members to operate their own stations in Field Day, the board voted to established a club competition. We will award HRO gift certificates to PAARA's top three single-operator stations and to the top multi-operator score. See the PAARAgraphs Field Day article for more information.

The ARRL Volunteer Monitor program is in full swing, including recognition of good operating practices: Among other hams, Good Operator Notices were given to a 13-year-old in North Carolina for CW operation during the Youth on the Air Special Event, and a 14-year-old in Wyoming for SSB operation. This is a great update of the long-standing "OO" program.

COVID continues to affect our activities: It's been announced that the IDXC meeting for next year will be a virtual meeting rather than an inperson meet in Visalia. This will be held over two weekends in April, 2021. It's also renamed to the IDXCC (International DX and Contesting Convention).

We still need members to write stories for PAARAgraphs: Consider writing up ham radio: experiences, projects, or anything ham-related. How has the virus affected your ham operations? What was your FD experience?

Secretary's Report:

Since the last board meeting, we have received 5 member renewals and gained two new members: We are pleased to welcome Stephen Sample Al6JV and Vincent Von Kaenel K6VVK to the club.

Treasurer's Report:

Income and expenses are in line with expectations, given the reduced level of club activity.

VP / Program Chair Report:

The July meeting speaker will be Joel Wilhite, KD6W. He will discuss Amateur Television. No field trips are currently planned. No T-shirts have been sold.

We have sold some more PAARA-owned equipment, including a set of 5 items to a club member, and also the Galaxy R-530 receiver.

Old Business

Repeater backup:

Joel and Jim have been working on installation of the 900 MHz repeater at the W6OTX site. The power and backup system is being designed for a 42 volt buss, with DC to DC converters to supply 12V.

PAARA Equipment Loan program:

The board reviewed the proposed program description and the Loan Agreement. With two editorial changes, the program is approved. Look for details in an upcoming PAARAgraphs.

New Business

We discussed holding all future board meetings via Zoom.

Meeting was adjourned at 8:40.

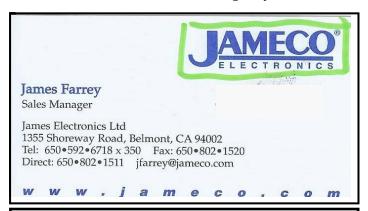




