Think Like a Backpacker George Zafiropoulos

Description: In this presentation, George will describe the process of design, theory of operation and use of the highly portable PackTenna HF wire antennas and thoughts for packing light when operating radio on the trail.

Bio: George has been a ham since 1972. He has a wide variety of radio interests including home brewing, QRP, and repeater building. His current station is a Flex 6400, an Elecraft K3, and a modest 6 band vertical (6BTV) and several QRP rigs. His favorite mode is HF CW and he can be found on DMR talk group 31075. Treasurer's Report: We issued checks for PAARAgraphs printing and for electricity cost for the repeaters.

VP / Program Chair Report: The May speaker is George Zafiropoulos KJ6VU, the developer of the PackTenna. His presentation is on "Packing Like a Backpacker"

Old Business:

We currently have no articles for next month's PAARAgraphs. Sunday is the deadline!

With no submissions, the next month's article will be titled "Lorem Ipsum, Dolor Sit Amet".

All members are encouraged to draft an article for PAARA, even a short one. PAARAgraphs is one of the key features of the club, and member articles make it so.

The board discussed the storage situation at the N6NV location. We need to organize a work party to haul electronic stuff from the house, once Gerry is ready.

New business:

PAARA equipment sale: Response to the sale posting was pretty good. We have raised \$3447 from sales of donated equipment. There is still a list of equipment on the PAARA website.

The board set dates for PAARA meetings from

September through August 2023, on the first Friday of each month except for September 8 (due to Labor Day).

Repeater update: still working. We need to update the microwave link for internet service from the repeater site. This is a backup link; the existing internet is currently working well.

Education Committee: The education committee has built an outline for an 'Intro to Ham Radio' presentation for new hams. It is arranged for one session, four hours. Date and location are TBD.

Electronic Flea Market: The next EFM is May 14, and PAARA is the sponsor. PAARA will sell vendor spaces, and also will sell donuts and coffee (\$2), and tea (\$1). We have many jobs to do: Members, please step up to volunteer! See the President's column for more information.

The April EFM was sponsored by WVARA (West Valley), and they netted about half the income of prior years, but it was income and not a loss.

Tower removal: The K6JAT tower removal work party is scheduled for April 23.

Field Day: We have not yet been successful in obtaining permits for Bayfront park from the city of Menlo Park. Ric N6AJS will provide a survey to measure the membership's interests.

The board decided to hold an in-person and zoom hybrid meeting for May. We need to start the meeting promptly at 7:00. Zoom support for meetings after May needs to be resolved.

Finances: The board reviewed the financial summaries for 2020 and 2021. Although these were unusual years due to the pandemic, the club has maintained a steady reserve, and had minimal net outflows for these two years.

The meeting was adjourned at 8:55 pm




