## PAARA Establishes Equipment Loan Program

Do you have a new or recent license upgrade? Are you interested in DX, SSB, international contesting? Are you concerned about the "thousand-dollar upgrade"? If so, PAARA has a program designed specifically for you!

Are you a 'seasoned ham', with experience to share? You should sign up as an 'Elmer' in support of this program!

PAARA, 'the friendliest club around' wants to encourage newer hams to get on the HF bands, and explore the many aspects of amateur radio. To that end, we have established an HF rig 'loaner program'.

This program was proposed by Doug, KG6LWE. He and Ric, N6AJS have put the details into practice.

Any PAARA member can arrange to borrow a club-owned transceiver system for 6 months, at no cost. A written agreement and a \$150 deposit are required.

up. Each loan comes with an 'Elmer' as part of the package: A seasoned ham will assist with antenna selection, equipment setup and operation, and will give advice and support to put the station on the air, and making contacts.

## II. Equipment

The Loaner station is an Icom IC-7300, which was a gift from the estate of a Silent Key club

member. Also included are the lcom desk microphone, and a power supply.

## IV What you need to do

- Get in touch with Doug or Ric (e-mail) to let us know you're interested. We will arrange contact with one of our club 'Elmers'. They will arrange a site visit to check out your QTH, and make suggestions for such things as antenna type and placement.
- 2. Build (or buy) and install an appropriate HF antenna.
- Review the manual to familiarize yourself with the rig and its operation. Learn the bands and frequency limits that you are permitted, and that will work with your antenna.

- 4. Sign the agreement, pay the deposit and pick up the equipment.
- 5. Meet with your Elmer at your QTH to finalize the installation and get on the air!
- 6. Your Elmer will be available for questions and advice during the loan period.

2023 project, an electronic badge, designed to gamify Ham radio, that combined ham radio, GPS, APRS, an OLED display, and a Raspberry Pi Pico processor. This device allowed users to participate in a text-based fantasy adventure with monsters and dragons while exploring the campsite.

The badge connected to a base station and computer, transmitting GPS data via APRS to position users in the campground. As players moved around the campsite, their in-game locations updated. The APRS system facilitated communication between the badge and server, enabling multiple users to collaborate in real-time to defeat virtual foes.

An additional feature of the gameplay was the use of text-to-speech technology, which narrated the gameplay to users as they received updates from the server. This added a deeper level of immersion for the users.

The project also taught practical ham radio skills through immersive gameplay. As players used the badge's radio transceiver, they gained hands-on experience with radio operation and network communication.

The Quartzfeng 2023 badge made Quartzfest enjoyable by blending engaging gameplay with valuable ham radio education, promoting teamwork, friendship, and skill development in a shared adventure.

Jeri and Amy will share details about how they created the badge and the lessons learned.






